Meeting 1

Movie Title: *Ratatouille – Remy and Emile in the Field (Opening scene until Remy says 'Imagine every flavor', ±1:50 minutes) – Remy and Emile in the Field*

Fokus: Introduction to Narrative Text

Definition

Narrative text is a text which tells a story with the purpose to entertain, teach a moral lesson, or both.

Narrative text adalah teks yang menceritakan suatu cerita dengan tujuan menghibur, memberikan pelajaran moral, atau keduanya.

Types of narrative text

Narrative texts can take various forms, such as fairy tales, mysteries, horror stories, science fiction, romance, legends, and other imaginative or experience-based stories.

Social function

The social function of a narrative text is to entertain the reader or listener through an engaging and meaningful story.

Generic structure

- **Orientation**

The opening part of a narrative text that introduces the characters and the setting of the story, including time, place, atmosphere, and social context.

- **Complication**

The part of the story where problems or conflicts arise. This stage may consist of:

- *Rising action*: the problem begins to develop
- *Climax*: the peak of the conflict
- *Falling action*: the tension decreases as the story moves toward a solution.

- **Resolution**

The part where the problem is solved or concluded. The ending may be a happy ending, a sad ending, or an open-ended conclusion (cliffhanger).

- **Re-orientation**

The closing section that may include a moral value, lesson learned, or changes in the characters. This part is optional and does not always appear in every narrative text.

Language Features

- Use of past tense
- Use of action verbs
- Use of time conjunctions (first, then, after that, finally)

Example from the film:

- **Orientation:** Remy and Emile (the rats) are scavenging food in the field.
- **Complication:** They argue about the importance of taste and smell.
- **Resolution:** They cooperate to collect food together.
- **Moral:** Appreciate differences and respect each other's opinions.

Meeting 2

Movie Title: *Tangled – Rapunzel Heals Flynn's Hand (Scene from Flynn's injury until Rapunzel starts singing, ±1:45 minutes)*

Focus: Identifying Generic Structure

Review of Generic Structure:

- **Orientation:** Introduction of who, when, where.
- **Complication:** The character faces a problem.
- **Resolution:** The problem is resolved.

Example from the film:

- **Orientation:** Rapunzel and Flynn are in the tower.
- **Complication:** Flynn's hand is injured and he refuses help.
- **Resolution:** Rapunzel heals Flynn with her magical hair.

Meeting 3

Movie Title: *Inside Out 2 – Meet Anxiety (Scene when Anxiety appears and introduces herself, ±1:55 minutes)*

Focus: Finding Main Idea and Supporting Details

Definition:

- **Main Idea:** The central message of a paragraph or text.
- **Supporting Details:** Additional information that explains or proves the main idea.

Example from the film:

Main idea: Riley experiences new emotions during her teenage years.

Supporting details: Introduction of new emotions (Anxiety, Envy, Embarrassment, etc.) and their influence on Riley's behavior.
