1.1 Background of Research

The Star Wars Episode III: Revenge of the Sith had its world premiere on May 15, 2005, at the Cannes Film Festival (Cironneau, 2015). The film was praised for its mature tone, story, emotional weight, action sequences, score, visual effects, and performances by McGregor, McDiarmid, Oz, and Jimmy Smits; it is widely regarded as the best prequel trilogy installment. The film's dialogue and Christensen's performance received most of the criticism. According to (Mojo, 2014), during its opening week, it set a number of records at the box office and went on to earn over \$868 million worldwide, making it the second-highest-grossing Star Wars film at the time. In 2005, it was the film with the highest grossing in the United States and the second highest grossing worldwide. It also holds the record for the most money made on opening day on a Thursday, with \$50 million being made. Star wars have a big effect to the people in a whole world, Sarah Yulianti on www.Kumparan.com said "it's not only a film to watch, but it's gave the positive effect to the viewer" (Sarah, 2019). The 501st Legion, known by the nickname Vader's Fist in the official website of <u>www.501st.com</u> in 2023, is made up entirely of volunteers. Founded in South Carolina in August 1997 by Albin Johnson and Tom Crews, Legion now has more than 14,000 active members worldwide, with more than 26,000 approved costumes. The Legion operates on 6 continents, with local units known as "Garrisons" and "Outposts" in over 60 countries. Members of the Legion appear at casual, promotional, and charity events, often at the request of Lucasfilm's Fan Events Department. While not officially affiliated with the Walt Disney Company or Lucasfilm LLC., the 501st Legion is Lucasfilm's chosen Imperial costume organization, and its members can be seen as extras in the official The Mandalorian series.

In this film, there was two side of force, the light of the force, and the dark side of the force. Every side have their own specific power, color, name, weapon, and behavior. Conventional symbol divided into 3 Kinds, they are color, nature, and human body Part.

In this research, the researcher is intended to find the symbolism of the dark side the *Star Wars episode III: Revenge of the sith* (2005). Talking about dark side, The Dark Side is the shrewd side inside us that emerges because of us not having any desire to acknowledge and detest the driving forces from the element of Desire (Scott, 2023).
